Dear Assisted Living Family Member(s),

As of April 14, Denver County no longer requires masks to be worn outdoors. However, the Public Health Order for Assisted Living and Congregate settings still requires that we wear masks while indoors and while interacting with our fellow staff and residents. Many people in the community have not been vaccinated, and it is recommended we all remain as cautious as possible during this next phase.

We are reminding your loved one to continue to wear a mask at Kavod, anytime they are out of their apartment or interacting with a staff member within their apartment. Masks are important in protecting everyone from the COVID-19 virus.

As you know, older adults are most vulnerable to the risk of severe illness if the coronavirus is contracted. We are asking residents to follow these practices for their best protection:

- [Wear a mask](#), when they interact with others.
- Report any sign of illness to the Care Partner immediately.
- Do not attend activities or meals if showing any signs of illness.
- [Wash hands](#) often. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or the inside of your elbow. Then wash hands.
- [Clean and disinfect surfaces](#) and things that are touched often.
