Dear Independent Living Family Member(s),

Kavod has completed 28+ days with zero (0) COVID-19 cases among staff or residents. This means we no longer have to test weekly. Our outbreak status with the public health department has also been officially removed.

As of April 14, Denver County no longer requires masks to be worn outdoors. Even though Kavod will follow suit, we recommend that residents and staff wear them outdoors, since many people have not been vaccinated.

Masks are STILL REQUIRED indoors, whether your loved one has been vaccinated or not. All residents need to continue to wear a mask at Kavod, anytime they are out of their apartments. Masks are important in protecting everyone from the COVID-19 virus.

As you know, older adults are most vulnerable to the risk of severe illness if the coronavirus is contracted. We are asking residents to follow these practices for their best protection:

- Wear a mask, when interacting with others.
- Limit in-person interactions with other people as much as possible, particularly when indoors.
- Keep space between yourself and others (stay 6 feet away, which is about 2 arm lengths).
- Wash hands often. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or the inside of the elbow. Then wash hands.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces and things that are touched often.
