





- **Rehabilitative Services:** On-site physical, occupational, and speech therapy by Legacy Healthcare
- **Specialty Clinics:** Audiology, optometry, dermatology, and podiatry (including nail clinics)
- **Holistic Pain Management:** Chiropractic care and acupuncture for mobility
- **Mental Health:** Comprehensive counseling
- **Preventive Oversight:** Blood pressure clinics
